Meeting started at 8:25 PM

Treasurer's Report: Greg gave the report. Reimbursement check from Council is still needed for Paul Dandrea. Terry will check in to it.

Past Events

FOS (Feb. 10): (12/23) Behrensmeyers have been told when we are having our Family Night. (1/27) We have not heard back for a confirmation. (03/03) We are one donation away from making our goal. 8 families have not participated yet and Phil will be contacting them. Our goal actually went down this year, but we should meet it. MaryAnn said each goal is formed by multiplying the number of boys by \$125, plus 40% more. (That sounds reasonable, but it doesn't compute.) Our goal was \$2,750. (03/31) Previously, Phil told Terry he needed one more pledge to make our goal.

Re-charter (by Feb. 28): (12/23) Terry has the packet. (1/27) 4 – 429, 6 – 400, 2 – 600 are planning on crossing over. Phil asked if we have people going to the Blue and Gold Banquets. Pack 429 is February 21st, 400 is February 22nd. [Post meeting note: Pack 600 is 2/22 and Pack 121 is 2/22 also.] (03/03) \$1140 for 36 scouts and 39 adults to be rechartered. We're adding 13 new scouts. Official number now is 49 youth and 42 adults. The new scouts either paid us or transferred from their packs. As a consistent benchmark, we recharter first, then add graduates. The most we have ever had is 53. (3/31) It was completed on time. Cost was \$1150. New boys were added in today at a cost of \$115. One more scout and two adults registered tonight. We still need one more scout to register. Our complete registered count will be 49 scouts and 49 adults. We have 3 or 4 adults who are multiples (primary in other units).

Scouting for Food (Feb. 28 and Mar. 7): Who is going to run it this year? It's suggested Ryan and Derek do it. (10/21) Motioned and carried, even though they opposed. (11/25) They did not disagree tonight either. (12/23) They did not disagree tonight either. Maybe Tim can do it for his Wood Badge ticket. (1/27) Do we have anyone officially running it? Phil was signed-up to help. (03/03) Ryan and Derek ran it. They had 18 people on Saturday; 10 youth and 8 adults. We put out approximately 600 bag/door hangers. More volunteered tonight to help out this Saturday for pickup. (Post-meeting note: 24 people participated on 3/7. We put 8 cars in 4 subdivisions; finished collecting about 11:00; and filled 11 shopping carts at Helping Hands Pantry.) (3/31) It was very successful, even though it rained. They knocked on doors asking for food. 1,810

items were collected and donated to Helping Hands pantry. They were very grateful. Ryan mentioned that he saw someone on the news talking about the pantry and that they mentioned the donations received from Troop 181 as well as another Troop. We got a Thank-You letter.

Adult Trainer Conference (Mar. 7): (1/27) Sandy said *The Trainer's Edge is train-the-trainer. Set for March 7th, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Christ United Methodist church on Alpine at Highcrest.* (3/31) Only Phil attended.

Lord Baden Powell University: Eric attended. MaryAnn was on staff.

Wilderness First Aid Training (Mar 28. & Apr. 4): (1/27) *It's required for Philmont and suggested for all High Adventure. It is March 28th and April 4th at Camp Lowden. The cost is \$90.* (3/31) No one from our Troop attended.

New Family Orientation (Mar. 14): (03/03) *Belinda and Tim worked on it tonight. We are having it at Christ United Methodist Church. All the adults spots are full and Tim was still recruiting scouts. Those who signed up will be emailed their information within the next week. Talent surveys should be handed-out at this also to see where our new parents' interests lie.* (3/31) It went well, however, it did go 30 minutes longer than planned, for which Belinda apologized to the families. We had 7 new scout families attend. The new families thought it was very informational. Pete said his family was unable to attend, but the binder he received; he thought was self-explanatory and really liked it.

Future Events

Eagle Cave (Apr. 4-5): (1/27) *We could not get Eagle Cave until April 4th weekend. The cost is \$35.75 each. Includes Saturday Lunch, Supper, and Sunday Breakfast. Someone suggested ½ the cost for adults. Sandy had to pay \$5 per person; she reserved 20 spots. Terry will come up with a flyer. Our new scouts (Webelos) will not be able to go because we have to have the deposit in 2 months in advance. Scouts will pay \$18, adults will pay \$12 with the troop picking up the rest. It was voted on and approved. We will re-address inviting new scouts (Webelos) if we have room available, but charge them \$30 since they have not contributed to the troop yet. It was suggested that they would have to bring an adult since it is their first campout. The cost would be the same for their adult. The vote resulted in one objection, and the others approved.* (03/03) *20 spots are reserved; 15 taken. Two Webelos scouts and their parents are begging to be included. We have to pay for 20. We are accepting the Webelos. We will still have 1 more spot available. We'll go up Saturday and come back on Sunday.* (3/31) The announcement was given at both meetings tonight. Terry reported enough drivers (4), plus extra adults going. Post-meeting note: 12 scouts and 9 adults went.

Wanchanagi Recognition Dinner (Apr. 5): (12/23) *Deadline to sign-up is Mar. 21 (not the 25th).* (1/27) *It was mentioned again.* (03/03) *This year it will be held at the Stockholm Inn. Cost is \$20.00. The restaurant is not open at that time, so we have the place to ourselves.* (3/31) It's this Sunday. 9 from our Troop registered to attend.

Blackhawk Area College (Apr. 4): (03/03) *Why? Terry said it is in the Courier. It is more training. It's being pushed through Commissioners and at Roundtables.* (3/31) Eric thought it had been cancelled. MaryAnn thought it was still on, but would find out Thursday night at her Commissioners meeting.

Cub Scout Pinewood Derby (Apr. 18-19): (03/03) *This council events needs volunteers, older scouts, good advertising for the troop to other packs. Phil said we need to participate, if possible.* (3/31) They are

still looking for workers, adults and scouts. 51 Adults are needed to run each session. Wanchanagi is the first session on Saturday.

Midwest Regional Extrication Competition (May 16-17): (03/03) *Are we still doing it? We need to find an adult to run it. Lois is not available this year. (3/31) Several volunteered to help run it. Sandy, Ryan, MaryAnn, Derek, Pete and Mike. They will get together and work out the details.*

NYLT (June 14-20): *Need to commit by April 21st and pay by May 1st. (03/03) We asked Matt if anyone has showed interest. We need to find out who is eligible. Terry said we need to start promoting it. Matt will be asking parents. (3/31) We do not have any commitments yet. Terry expects 2 or 3 to go. It was suggested that individual contacts be made. Derek, Alex, Matt and Craig will talk to boys who are eligible.*

BMX Food Tent (June 18-21): (03/03) *Belinda is willing to help, but would prefer not to be in charge. Suggested she train a new parent. Suggestions will be made to the new parents at the Orientation. (3/31) Belinda is not available on Friday to set-up. Phil works during the day and cannot set-up. We really need someone to help with this. Eric said he could possibly help but mentioned that the Venture Crew may be going out-of-town that weekend. He would get back to us. Highly recommended that people consider helping and let Belinda or Phil know.*

Summer Camp at Lowden (July 5-11): *Summer camp at Camp Lowden has been reserved. The Council needs \$100 deposit to hold the date. (10/21) Sandy needs another \$100; it is a \$200 deposit. (1/27) Sandy needs to pay by April 5th, youth \$225, adults \$150. We would like to know how much points will be worth this year. In the past we had to pay \$25, and sometimes \$50. Terry proposes \$50 per Scout. Then full points are worth \$175.00. Craig seconds it. Voted on and approved. Approximately \$6,000 will be spent on summer camp, based on 30 scouts and 2 or 3 adults. (03/03) Sandy presented it tonight and sent something to Lori to put on the website. Lowden cost is \$225 by April 15th and \$275 late fee after May 15th. (3/31) Points are being tallied. Slips will be given out next week letting people know how much they will owe. Money must be paid by April 15th, except for new scouts. They have until May. Sandy got a tally of which adults will be going. It was suggested that we promote Citizenship in the World merit badge at camp, because they usually have someone from another country who is a Scout that boys can talk to, which is one of the requirements. Paul McCaffrey is willing to work with boys on this merit badge.*

High adventure camp (2009): (5/20) *Paul brought the information on High Adventure Camps in Maine. The Boy Scout High Adventure one has 3 levels of Kayaking. You get to pick your own trek anywhere from calm waters to whitewater trails. The cost is about \$900 without travel fee. This covers everything they need. The duration of the trip is 6-days minimum, up to 8-days. If both boys and girls will be going we would need one adult of each sex to attend. The crew size should be 6 to 8. Maine High Adventure is the name. Deposit would be due by March 1st for reservation. Balance would be due upon arrival. The other ones he has are not Boy Scout run, but are private outfitters and the costs are similar. Ed suggests put options to boys and let them choose. Paul gave Belinda the brochure on it. (6/10) Tabling until it can be presented to the boys and they chose one. (07/22) Still tabled. (08/26) We talked a little about Sea Base, also about canoeing. Sandy suggested putting a person in charge of taking ideas. Sandy said she will do it. Ed will announce it at next meeting. Hopefully, there will be some planning at the September meeting. (09/30) Ed announced that we need to come up with ideas. Send them to Ed via email. They need to be to him before the November Court of Honor so we can present it that night to the boys. (10/21) Sandy suggested Washington DC; maybe tie it into a Jamboree 2010 visit. (1/27) Ed is not here to talk about it. (03/03) Ed suggested whitewater rafting or up to the Boundary Waters. It was also suggested that we combine something with the Jamboree next year and go through West Virginia. MaryAnn asked how many would qualify? Sandy suggested we check with the boys to*

see if there is an interest. It was \$460 2-years ago. Ed is still in charge and we are going to offer whitewater rafting in West Virginia; dates will be set next month. (3/31) Eric gave the information to Ed. We need to bring it up to the boys Monday after swimming to see who is interested. A tally should be recorded.

The Tall Ship, Windy (Aug. 22): *The cost is \$750 -- 50 people would make it \$15 per person. There will be a campout with it. Terry says we should consider inviting other troops or packs to fill-out our minimum costs, like we did last time. A \$250 deposit is needed. (10/21) Sandy paid the deposit and suggested we invite Webelos to come for the day also. (11/25) Concentrate on Webelos I and II of associated packs; take fliers to their Blue and Gold Banquets. We may offer it to other troops also. (1/27) Nothing new. (03/03) Nothing new. (3/31) Nothing new. It was pointed-out that it is the same weekend as Wood Badge.*

National Scout Jamboree (2010) – *It's something for us to consider! (08/26) The internet Courier gives the following information that is being passed around. Greg mentioned that he picked-up some brochures at summer camp and they were back with our paperwork in the back room. We discussed it and there was a suggestion that we could possibly just go as visitors. Nothing was decided, just discussed. Terry said he thought this was the last time that it would be in Virginia. (09/30) Nothing new. (10/21) The council is still looking for people to attend. They want to fill two troops (72-scouts and 8-adults at \$2000 each), and aren't half way there yet. If they don't get enough in a couple of weeks they will be dropping one of the troops. We believe any scout troop can visit on one day. (11/25) Sign-up ends in January. (1/27) We believe they were only able to fill one troop along with a couple alternates. (03/03) Council did not get enough for a second troop, but the council is keeping it and extending the opportunity. (3/31) Council still needs more people.*

Wood Badge For the 21st Century C-25-08 (Aug. 22-24 and Sep. 19-21, 2008): (5/20) Tim is all set to go. Belinda signed-up and paid today. (6/10) Nothing new to report. (07/22) Ideas for tickets are; make up schedules for Roundtable, see MaryAnn. Sandy said you can volunteer at Day Camp also. (08/26) Belinda and Tim attended their first session this last weekend. Sandy is on staff as a Troop Guide. (09/30) Belinda had to tell what her ticket items were; we will get Tim's next month. (10/21) Tim is working his ticket. He is doing Woodcutters Ball, Baloo training, New Scout orientation, Community Pinewood Derby, and one other item. Belinda has 1 done. (1/27) Tim had a problem with one item, but he will be back on track. He has one done. Belinda has 2 done, 1 more this weekend, and 2 waiting for events to occur. (03/03) Belinda has 3 items done and her 4th one is coming around with the New Family Orientation on the 14th. (3/31) Belinda and Tim completed ticket items by conducting the New Family Orientation. Belinda has one left, which she is hoping to complete in April. We do not know where Tim is on his ticket completions.

Wood Badge For the 21st Century C-54-09 (Aug. 21-23 and Sept. 18-20, 2009):

2009 announcements are out. Tom Siefken will be the course director. (11/25) Dates are now set. (1/27) Phil encourages people to attend for this year. Our troop pays for it. You pay \$50 deposit up front and get reimbursed when you complete it. Phil will be on staff for this course. (03/03) We have 3 interested – Ryan, Derek and Greg. Derek has committed to it. (3/31) Only 11 are registered so far. Edmund Lopez is also interested in taking it.

Miscellaneous Business

A garage at the fire station: (08/26) Building permit! Contractor! And groundbreaking this week!! (09/30) We saw the framing up for the garage at the Fire Station. They are working on it. When theirs is complete, we will get 2/3 of their old building. (1/27) Nothing new. (03/03) Nothing new. (3/31) Bill said it is standing. The construction has not moved forward lately. He will let us know when it is completed.

Rotary Sign: (09/30) Rev. Richard Wang, former minister at CVUMC, said the Rotary sign needs to be repaired. He suggested a scout take it as a project. It's a sign with a case that takes announcements; it belongs to the Rotary Club. Resources could be provided. They would really like a scout or the troop to take on the project. Ed showed an interest and got his phone number. They would like to have it done before the winter sets in. (10/21) It's a small sign. Who's going to do it? (11/25) Nick Horan is looking for an Eagle project. Ed will look at it and see if it is big enough for an Eagle project. Ed will contact Rev. Wang. (12/23) Terry will look at it. We need to get back to Reverend Wang and do this as soon as the weather gets warmer. (1/27) Terry looked at pictures from Ed, and drove past it. It is not big enough for an Eagle project, but the Troop should do it anyway. (03/03) It will be a Troop project when the weather gets nicer. It's on State Street. It was originally an Eagle project for someone from Troop 57. It has weathered. It needs to be refinished. It is on the Fire Department property. Terry said it should be done by a couple of people. (3/31) Nothing new.

Popcorn: We need to recruit a new Popcorn Kernel. Jessica wants out. (03/03) Phil asked if any of our new leaders have popcorn experience. Nobody knew. (3/31) The orders were due last week. There is nothing else to report at this time.

100 Year Celebration: (01/27) Sandy heard new information at Pow Wow. We need to add these to our calendar. One is a biking trip, 100 miles. There is an Arbor Day event, a geocaching event, and more. Hall of Leadership award is also available, nominations February 8th through August 31st of 2009.

Missing calendar links: *Roller skating, first aid meet, Eagle cave. (03/03) Roller skating was put on today. Tracy will be coordinating it for us. First Aid is not working. Eagle Cave is not working. (3/31) It's working.*

Website: *(03/03) John Vermie wrote our website. It was originally on a server owned by a company that he had a share of. He sold his share with the stipulation that we would always have free space. The people that John sold it to sold it again and now a new company is looking at buying the server. We should start looking at a new host. Phil will talk with Lori about researching new companies. (3/31) Nothing new.*

Cost of campouts: *(03/03) It is now \$8.00. Based on what we have been spending on campouts, along with the rise in gas and food, it's suggested we raise it. It was not intended to pay for them but to get commitments from people. Terry has been trying to get Greg to figure out what we have been spending on campouts, but we have never been able to get all the figures. Tracy volunteered to help Greg get this organized and put on a spreadsheet. They would like to go back at least 3 years. It was suggested that the amount be submitted whether a person wants to be reimbursed or not so records can be kept better. There was a suggestion that this be presented to the new families also at the Orientation. We will keep it the same as it for now but will review it periodically. (3/31) Nothing new.*

Troop 57 Scout Fundraiser: *(03/03) A scout in Troop 57 has been diagnosed with bone cancer. Shepherd of the Valley Church is doing a fundraiser soon to help with the family's cost. They are also going to be doing a Blood Drive in May. MaryAnn said several of our boys came from Pack 429 and know the Scout. It was mentioned that we should be involved. (3/31) The blood drive is going to be for Jefferson High School staff and students only. A Scoopie Night is going to be done as a fundraiser. There is information on this as well as updates on the Scout through Troop 57's website. Post-meeting note: Scoopie Night at Culvers was a tremendous success!*

Advancements: *(03/03) Our 2008 advancement rate was 35.6%. That just shows rank. We are below other troops. We need to push Patrol Coaches and advancements. (3/31) We need to work on swimming requirements during swim nights. Also, we need to push getting Patrol Coaches, who can keep up with the boys' advancements and help them along. Dannette can get a list of the advancements and merit badges to the Patrol Coaches to help them identify areas that boys need to work in. Belinda will talk to the new families to try to get them to sign on. She will talk to Tim to see if he would be willing to help in this area. We need to get Patrol Coaches for our older patrols. A lot of the boys in the older patrols seem to be at a stand-still and need some encouragement to move along.*

New Business

Lincoln Pilgrimage (April 25-26): *(3/31) We need to start promoting it. Also, we should promote working on Citizenship in the Nation. Some of the requirements can be fulfilled during this campout.*

Tree Lot (April 7): *(3/31) We need to do another clean-up. The lawn needs to be raked as it was matted-down during the winter. Also, we need to clean-up the yard. It was suggested that we do it next Tuesday at 6:00 pm, if the weather permits (we do not have a scout meeting that night due to swimming on Monday). It will be promoted at swim night. The normal troop clean-up points will be in place for all those who help. We also need to encourage the families to bring rakes.*
