Saturday, November 5, 2011**

Session #	Session Description
First Period: 8:45 – 10:15	
101	<u>Part A - Cub Scout Leader Position Specific Training</u> – This is the first part of the required Cub Scout leader training. Topics include an introduction to Cub Scouting, fundamentals of Cub Scouting, what Cub Scout leaders do, how to make Cub Scouting work, how to have FUN with the den and pack, and how to have successful den and pack meetings and activities. To be trained at your position and receive the "Trained" patch, you must also attend one of the "Part B" sessions offered during Periods 3 <u>and</u> 4 OR Periods 5 <u>and</u> 6 <u>and</u> have completed Cub Scout Fast Start, "This Is Scouting," and Youth Protection training (these are e-learning sessions that can be taken on the Internet). Note: Session offered twice – see session 201.
102	<u>Time for Tiger Cubs</u> – The Tiger Cub program is the first Scouting experience for most boys and parents. This session will help make it GRRRRREAT!
103	<u>The First Step</u> – Become a "First Step" mentor. For Cub Scout leaders who want to develop a successful Den Leader mentor program in their unit.
104	<u>Cub Scouts and Webelos Knots</u> – Learn how to tie and how to teach knots shown in the Cub Scout and Webelos Handbooks
105	<u>Webelos Mental and Technology Activity Groups</u> – Alternate methods and ideas beyond the <i>Webelos Handbook</i> for the Webelos activity badges included in the mental and technology activity groups.
106	<u>Cubmaster Corner</u> – The Cubmaster is responsible for much more than being the master of ceremonies at the pack meeting. The Cubmaster is also responsible for making memories. Discover ways to make your pack meeting shine!
107	<u>Crafts, Crafts, and More Crafts</u> – Spark a boy's imagination with crafts and neckerchief slides. "Busy hands are happy hands!"
108	<u>Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 1 of 6)</u> – This is a six-part session. You must also attend sessions 208, 308, 408, 508, and 608. This leader specific training is for Scoutmasters, assistant Scoutmasters, and anyone wanting to learn about Boy Scout troop operations. Learn how a "boy-led" troop operates. Have confidence managing the Scoutmaster role and learning the resources available to ensure success. (To earn the "Trained" patch, you must have also completed Boy Scout Fast Start, "This Is Scouting," Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills <i>and</i> Youth Protection training.)
109	<u>Troop Committee Challenge (Part 1 of 2)</u> – This is a two-part session. You must also attend session 209. This leader specific training is for everyone on the troop committee. It provides an overview of all the positions of the committee and how they contribute to the success of a troop. To earn your "Trained" patch you must have also completed "This Is Scouting" and Youth Protection training (these are e-learning sessions that can be taken on the Internet).
110	<u>Additional Awards to be Earned by the Scouts</u> – Do you want to go above and beyond the regular advancement rank? There are many awards to add excitement and skills to your unit. Join us and find out what they are and how to earn them.
111	<u>Leaders Camping Comfortably</u> – Roughing it doesn't mean pull up your rock and leaf and not sleep all night. There are many pieces of equipment and resources to make your camping experience a comfortable one. You just may never want to leave.
112	<u>Pioneering (Part 1 of 2)</u> – Learn pioneering skills from Scouters who have mastered them over the years. You'll learn how to tie the knots and lashings needed to do everything from build bridges to make a tripod so you can hang your coffee pot over the fire. Rope making and other "old-time" technology will also be covered.
113	<u>Venturing Leader Specific Training (Part 1 of 6)</u> – This is a six-part session. You must also attend sessions 213, 313, 413, 513, and 613. This is the required basic leader's course for all adult Venturing leaders. Venturing Youth Protection is included. Upon completion of this 6-part session <i>and</i> "This Is Scouting," adults will receive the "Trained" patch. Youth members may also attend, but will not be authorized to wear the "Trained" patch. Venturers can take sessions 115, 215, etc. for their Venturing Leader Skills Course.
114	<u>Program Planning and Advancements</u> - Learn how to work with your youth to plan an exciting year and incorporate the advancements.
115	<u>Venturing Leadership Skills Course for Youth (Part 1 of 6)</u> – This is a six-part session. You must also attend sessions 215, 315, 415, 515, and 615. An interactive orientation crew officer training. It is designed to teach leadership skills to all Venturers in the crew and to teach you how to plan your annual program. This course uses a series of leadership modules divided into four categories: vision, communication, organization, and synergism.
116	<u>Den Chief Training (Part 1 of 6)</u> – This is a six-part session. You must also attend sessions 216, 316, 416, 516, and 616. This session is for Boys Scout or Venturing crew youth who are current or future den chiefs. You will learn their duties in the Cub Scout program while learning the leadership, organization, and problem solving skills needed for success. The Scouts will receive the "Trained" patch for the den chief position at the completion of all 6 sessions.
117	<u>Commissioner Basic Training (Part 1 of 6)</u> – This is a six-part session. You must also attend sessions 217, 317, 417, 517, and 617. Learn why we have unit commissioners, the basics to be effective, top priorities, and how to help the unit succeed in delivering a quality Scouting program. Upon completion of this 6-part session, you will receive the "Trained" patch.
118	<u>Commissioner "New Unit Retention, Starting New Units" Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – "Nuts" = New Unit Team Specialist. This is a two-part session. You must also attend session 218. A team concept designed to use experienced Scouters in short term assignments to recognize charter partners, recruit both adults and youth, and assist the new unit until they are strong enough to operate on their own. We will review a 12-step method to achieving healthy units. This session is recommended for <i>experienced</i> district chairmen, district commissioners, membership chairs, committee members, assistant district commissioners, unit commissioners, and district professionals.
119	<u>CPR Certification (part 1 of 2)</u> – Get your CPR certification with the Belvidere Fire Men. This Class does cost extra and you will need to take both parts 1 and 2 to be completely certified.
120	<u>BALOO Training (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation)</u> – This is a required course for our Cub Scout Leaders wanting to take their units out camping. It will be an entire day (six sessions) of classes geared to teach you how to have a safe and fun experience with your Cub Units.

207	<u>Keeping Your Den Meeting Moving</u> – From the gathering activity to the closing ceremony, this session provides ideas on how to keep the Cub Scouts interested and participating.
208	<u>Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 2 of 2)</u> – Part two of session 108.
209	<u>Troop Committee Challenge (Part 2 of 2)</u> – Part two of session 109.
210	<u>Cold Weather Camping Basics</u> – When the weather turns cold, the outdoors is transformed. Mosquitoes and pesky flies vanish, the woods are almost absent of humans, and trails in the snow provide great insight to where animals can be found and how they live and survive in the bush. Among other things, this course will teach you how to be comfortable in a winter camp, what tent to use, what sleeping bag to spend the night in, and how to cook good meals quickly with a minimum of effort.

301	<u>Part B - Tiger Cub Den Leader Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) Discusses the purposes of the Tiger Cub program, what a Tiger Cub den leader does, how to plan and conduct a den meeting and "Go See It" activity, Tiger Cub advancement, Tiger Cub behavior issues, and how to have fun with Tiger Cubs. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 401.
302	<u>Part B - Wolf/Bear Cub Scout Den Leader Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) The information and resources on what it takes to be a Wolf or Bear Cub Scout den leader. Presents the purposes of the Cub Scout program, what a Wolf/Bear Cub Scout leader does, how to plan and conduct a Wolf/Bear den meeting, Wolf/Bear advancement, Wolf/Bear Cub Scout behavior issues, and how to have FUN with Wolf/Bear Cub Scouts. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 402.
303	<u>Part B - Webelos Den Leader Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) Learn about your role in the Webelos den and how that affects the lives of boys. Includes purposes of the Webelos program, what a Webelos den leader does, how to plan and conduct a Webelos den meeting, Webelos advancement, Webelos behavior issues, and how to have fun with Webelos Scouts. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 403.
304	<u>Planning for the Blue and Gold Banquet</u> – Behind the scenes details to make this event THE celebration to remember.
305	<u>How to Plan a Webelos Scout Overnight</u> – An in-depth discussion concerning the exciting overnight experience from planning to go home. This does NOT replace Webelos Leader Outdoor Training.
306	<u>Pack & Den Discipline</u> – Learn positive techniques to keep your boys' attention and encourage good behavior.
307	<u>Leatherwork (Part 1 of 2)</u> – Learn the basic techniques of leather working and take home a project you make. An additional cost of \$5.00 will be charged for this session. The cost will cover the materials that you will work on and then bring home. This is a two-part session. The time is spread out in order to allow your project to dry before tooling. Must also complete session 507.
308	<u>Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 3 of 6)</u> – Part three of session 108.
309	<u>Merit Badge Counselors Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – Do you want to be a merit badge counselor, find out about merit badge changes, or just learn where to find and recruit merit badge counselors? As a counselor, discover how to make the merit badge earning process a valuable experience for the Scout. This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 411.
310	<u>First Class Express</u> - this will show you how to set up your meetings to get your new scouts to First Class in their first year.
311	<u>Backpacking Stoves and Water Filters (Part 2 of 2)</u> – These items are "musts" for high adventure treks and even weekend backpacking. Learn about various types of stoves, what fuels to burn, and how to use them. Water filtration and water purification are two different things. Learn about the pros and cons about the various types of filters "which handle bacteria" and purification methods will kill "viruses and bacteria". Must also take session 411.
312	<u>Basic and Advanced Outdoor Cooking</u> – Learn some skills of how to take those home recipes and use them in the outdoors. From the easy to the difficult this is the delicious class for you.
313	<u>Venturing Leader Specific Training (Part 3 of 6)</u> – Part three of session 113.

314	<u>Beginner Map and Compass</u> – Have you heard of the gadget called a compass and wondered what does this thing do? Find your way into this class and in no time you will be able to understand the basics of what maps and compasses do and how they can help you on that next hiking adventure.
315	<u>Introduction to Leadership Skills Course (Part 3 of 6)</u> – Part three of session 115.
316	<u>Den Chief Training (Part 3)</u> – Part three of session 116.

407	<u>Using Denners and Den Chiefs</u> – You need help and these boys can provide it! Don't underestimate their potential. Everyone benefits when you understand what the boys are capable of and how to use them best!
408	<u>Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 4 of 6)</u> – Part four of session 108.
409	<u>Merit Badge Counselors Training (Part 2 of 2)</u> – Part two of session 311.

501	<u>Part B - Pack Committee Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) This session defines the role of the pack committee, discusses the makeup and functions of the committee, lists the people who support the committee, explains the pack planning process, how packs are funded, and where packs can get help. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 601.
502	<u>Part B - Cubmaster Training (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) Learn about your role in the pack as a Cubmaster, assistant Cubmaster, or prospective Cubmaster. Discuss the Cub Scout advancement program, the importance of pack program planning, planning a pack meeting, the Cubmaster Award, and how to succeed as a Cubmaster. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 602.
503	<u>Part B - Training for the Pack Trainer (Part 1 of 2)</u> – (This is the second part of Cub Scout Leader Specific Training) This session shows what it takes to be a pack trainer, including the role of the pack trainer, required training for Cub Scout leaders, and supplemental training for Cub Scout leaders. The pack trainer is an important role performed by an experienced Cub Scout leader who helps other pack leaders learn about their responsibilities and provides training for them as needed. Note: This is a two-part session. You must also complete session 603.
504	<u>How to Get Stuff For Free</u> –This session will help you use things you have around your home or how to get out there and scrounge. A scout is thrifty.
505	<u>Fundraising</u> – All units need money to work. Come get some creative ways to help your pack go.

506	<u>Flag Etiquette and Ceremonies</u> – Learn the proper way to handle, display, and fold the flag. Learn some basics for ceremonies to go along with the flag.
507	<u>Leatherwork (Part 2 of 2)</u> – Part two of session 307
508	<u>Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 5 of 6)</u> - Part five of session 108.
509	<u>Life to Eagle & Eagle Court of Honor (Part 2 of 3)</u> – Come get the nuts and bolts of Eagle Scout projects and different ceremony possibilities. How do you ensure you have a quality program? What are some non-traditional recruiting techniques you can use? What can you do to make open houses a real attention grabber?
513	<u>Venturing Leader Specific Training (Part 5 of 6)</u> – Part five of session 113.
514	<u>Advanced Map, Compass and Geocaching</u> – Come to this session to get a more in depth look at how these tools work.

608	<u>Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training (Part 6 of 6)</u> – Part six of session 108.
609	<u>Life to Eagle & Eagle Court of Honor (Part 3 of 3)</u> – Part three of session 410 and 509.
610	<u>Keep the Outing in Scouting</u> - the campouts are fun but how does the committee prepare for them. Learn ways to research ideas for outings, how to keep them safe, and the paper work necessary to make them happen.
611	<u>Totin' Chip and How to teach it.</u> – Every Boy Scout wants to carry a knife. Come learn the basics of how to teach the Totin' chip to your scouts, and you can be the one who brings this joy to them.
612	<u>Primitive Fire Making-A History and Demonstration of The Skills</u> – Boy Scouts have always been known as young men who could start fires without matches. This course will demonstrate how to do it using a bow drill, flint and steel, and the fire-piston. It will also explain how, and why, each method works, the history of its use, and tell how you can learn more and obtain materials so you can teach you're Scouts.
613	<u>Venturing Leader Specific Training (Part 6 of 6)</u> – Part six of session 113.
614	<u>Starting a Venturing Unit in your Boy Scout Troop</u> -What an exciting program for those boys in your unit 13 and up and graduated 8th grade. Come learn how this can be part of your unit and how to make it work.
